Year 11 - Bacon Butties Blaster Sessions Start Next Week


To help our GCSE students start their exams full of confidence and energy, many days in May and June begin with bacon and blasters (B&B) for Year 11. Students are served a free breakfast before <u>core subject</u> exams from 8am. Every exam, whether morning or afternoon is preceded by a blaster. This 20-minute session with a specialist subject teacher, who students know well, is created to calm nerves and remind students of exam technique and timing for each paper. We aim to build confidence and set our students up to show off what they know.

GCSE examinations are rigorous and demanding, intended to measure and demonstrate a young person's all round learning in education up to this point in Year 11. Many students have already sat speaking and/or practical components of their exams and produced a high standard of work. The intensive season of written exam papers begins straight after the early May bank holiday and continues until late June. Students each sit 25-30 papers over 6-7 weeks. They will often have GCSE exams in two different subjects on one day. Where they sit subjects set by different exam boards, there could occasionally be three exams on the same day!

Research shows and we agree, that students revise better by working in a structured envioronment at school with subject experts than they do at home by themselves. For this reason, MRC insists all students attend college daily throughout the exam season, going to all lessons around the exams of course. Students must wear correct uniform - no leavers hoodies (please see note further down the newsletter).

On the afternoon of Wednesday 12 June, Year 11 staff and students will enjoy a lunch together after the traditional celebration assembly. We have, of course, arranged for the ice cream van to come along as well. After this date, we will all see students coming and going in smaller numbers, to attend their own blasters and the remaining exams. The students certainly deserve a lovely, long summer break after so much hard work, something to look forward to as they begin their exams next week.

ASSESSMENTS COMING UP!

Week beginning : 6 May 2024

Assessments are coming up for the following year groups

- Year 10 : United Learning assessments begin this week for English (7 May 2024 onwards)
- Year 10 : all other subjects over three weeks beginning 10 June 2024
- Year 9 : all subjects (except Science) in the fortnight beginning 10 June 2024
- Year 8 : all subjects in the fortnight beginning 10 June
- Year 7 : all subjects in the fortnight beginning 3 June 2024

Prior to half-term, class teachers will be sharing details of forthcoming assessments with your child, including the length of assessment, type of questions, topics that will be in the assessment and some revision activities that will be useful to help your child prepare. This will be available on Arbor as an assignment.

Additional information and revision guidance can be found on the college website <u>(https://www.mrc-academy.org/curriculum/revision-resources)</u> at any time; this page provides useful ideas and strategies to support independent and effective revision by any child at any time.

Please support your child in preparing well for these assessments with effective revision, adequate rest the night before and a good breakfast to fuel them for the day. It is also very helpful to ensure students have appropriate equipment – pens, pencils, highlighters as a minimum. We are also mindful that these assessments can create a degree of stress and anxiety – please do contact your Head of Year for support and advice should this be the case.

100 Mile Walk for St Mungo's






