1. Parents Evening

We hope you have signed up already for face-to-face appointments with your child's subject teachers. Staff will praise hard work, explain your child's progress towards GCSE and let you know what s/he needs to do differently this term to accelerate progress if required. Please note the 5-minute slots will fly by, so it is a good idea to note down your questions in advance. Staff will not be able to run over the time slot as this will make you late for the next appointment and impact other parents. We strongly encourage students to attend with their parents. In this way they can hear praise and advice first hand and/or ask for clarification at school afterwards if needed.

2. PROM 2025

We are excited to invite your child to the Class of 2025 Prom, a wonderful final opportunity to celebrate the friendships and bonds we've created since meeting in Year 7. The Prom will take place on Thursday, 3 July 2025, at the Old Thorns Hotel in Liphook. The exact times and final detail will be shared at a later date.

All students are invited to the Prom, and we encourage parents and carers to pay for the event in stages over the next six months. A deposit of £15 will need to be paid, with the total cost being £55. Booking will open on Monday, 13 January 2024, at 4 pm, you will be able to book via Arbor.

Please contact Mr. Lamb if you are in a difficult financial situation making the cost of Prom unmanageable for your household, as we can sometimes support families with the cost of Prom to ensure every student is able to attend.

3. The Final Push Evening

Once parents and students have received individualised feedback on 15 January, it is very helpful to attend the Final Push Event.

On 22 January, we start around 5.30pm with a chance to put questions to MRC Heads of Department over tea and coffee. At 6.00pm Mrs Lunskey and Mr Lamb will present briefly to all in the theatre on subjects of promoting wellbeing supporting students at home and at school during this last part of Year 11 and during the GCSE exams. After this, Directors of core subjects will work with smaller groups. You will work through a carousel of hands-on activities aimed at allowing students to show parents how they rise to some of the challenges involved in the forthcoming exams. These sessions are always enjoyed by parents giving them a clearer understanding of how they can help with revision at home.

We aim to finish the event by 7.30pm and hope to see you all there.
